

How to make Polyglots toys

(orangutan, panda, fruit and bamboo stick)

Paper toys

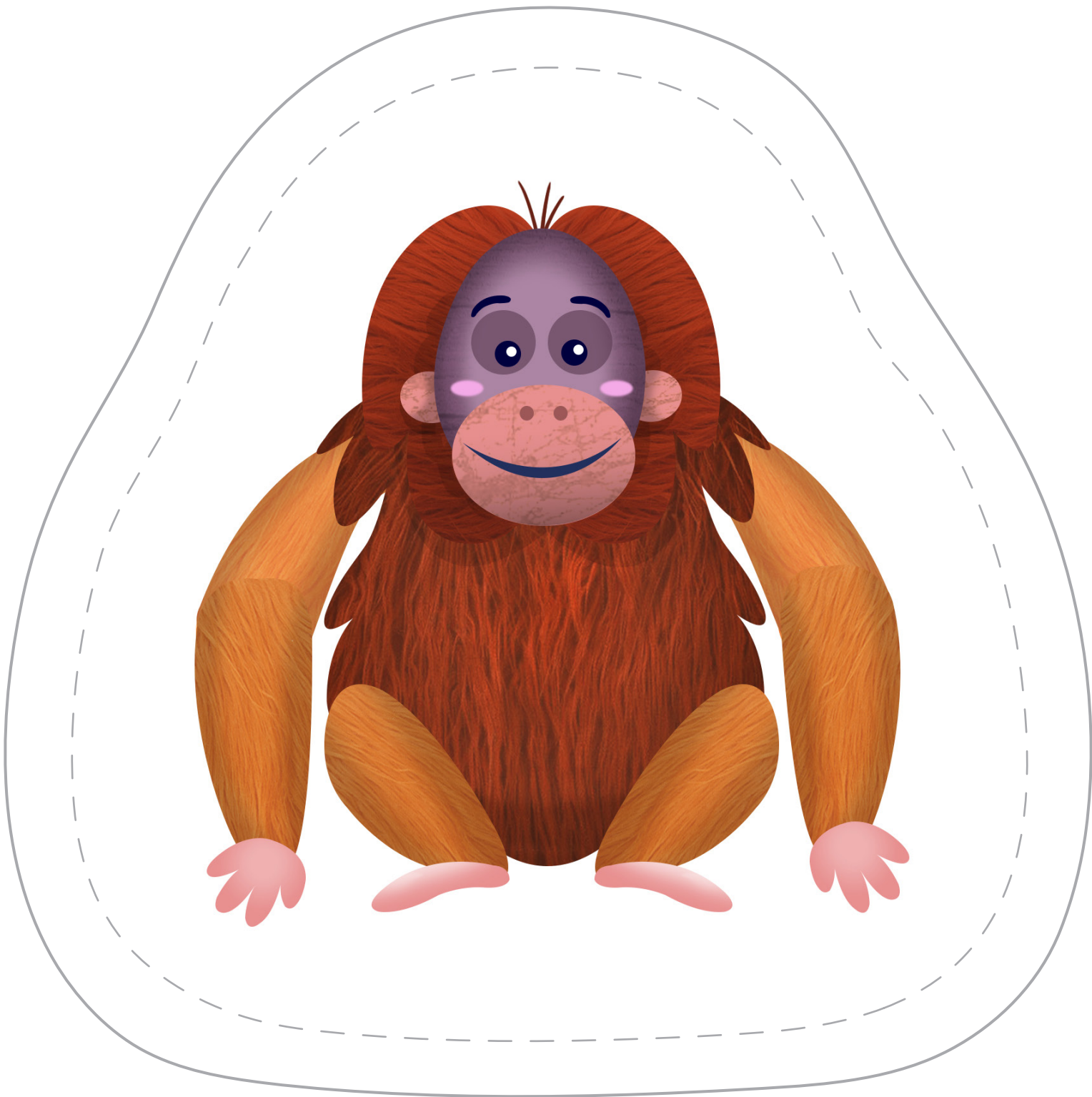
1. Print the template onto A4 paper.
2. Place the printed page on top of another piece of A4 paper and cut out.
3. Staple along the dotted line.

Alternatively, you can cut out the image and paste it onto a paper bag, wooden block or paper plate, or laminate it.

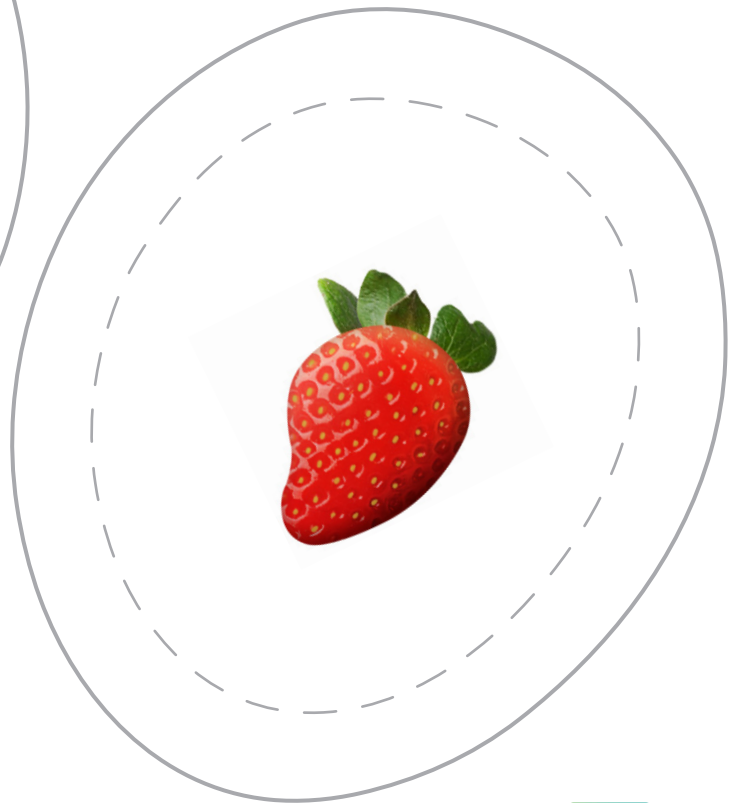
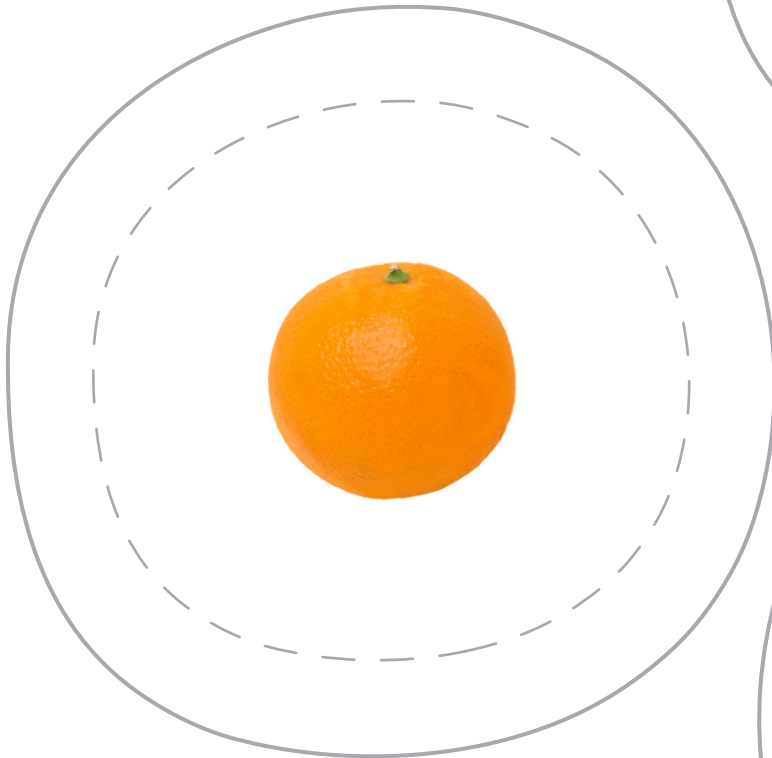
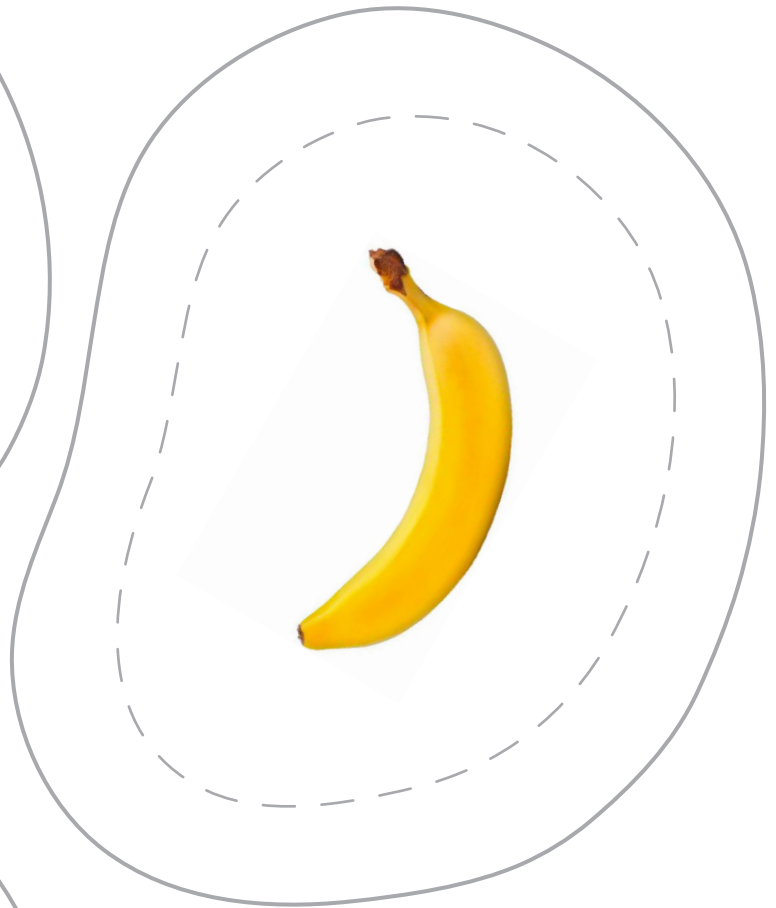
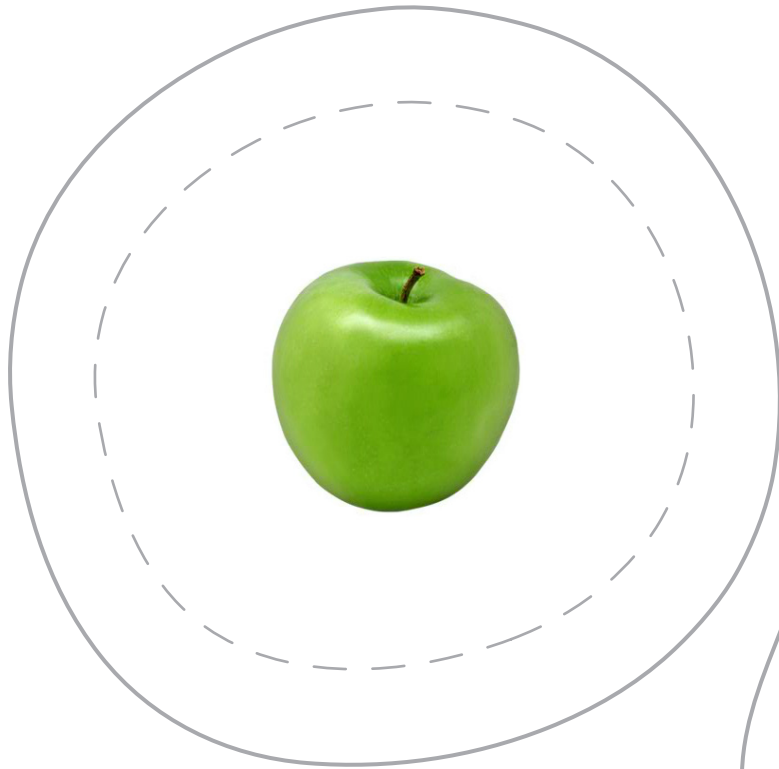
1. Purchase iron-on transfer paper. This is available from Officeworks, Spotlight, Lincraft, Arthouse Direct and other craft supply shops. To stuff the toys you could use fibre stuffing also known as 'hobby fill' (available from craft shops) or use fabric scraps, shredded paper, wheat or rice.
2. Print the image onto the transfer paper using an **inkjet** printer or copier.
3. Iron the printed images onto fabric. Fabrics such as cotton drill, calico or broadcloth work best.
4. Cut along the **solid** line.
5. Lay the piece of fabric with the printed image face down on another piece of the fabric.
6. Sew along the **dotted** line or a 1 cm seam allowance, leaving an opening large enough so you can stuff the toy.
7. Stuff the toy.
8. Sew closed the opening.



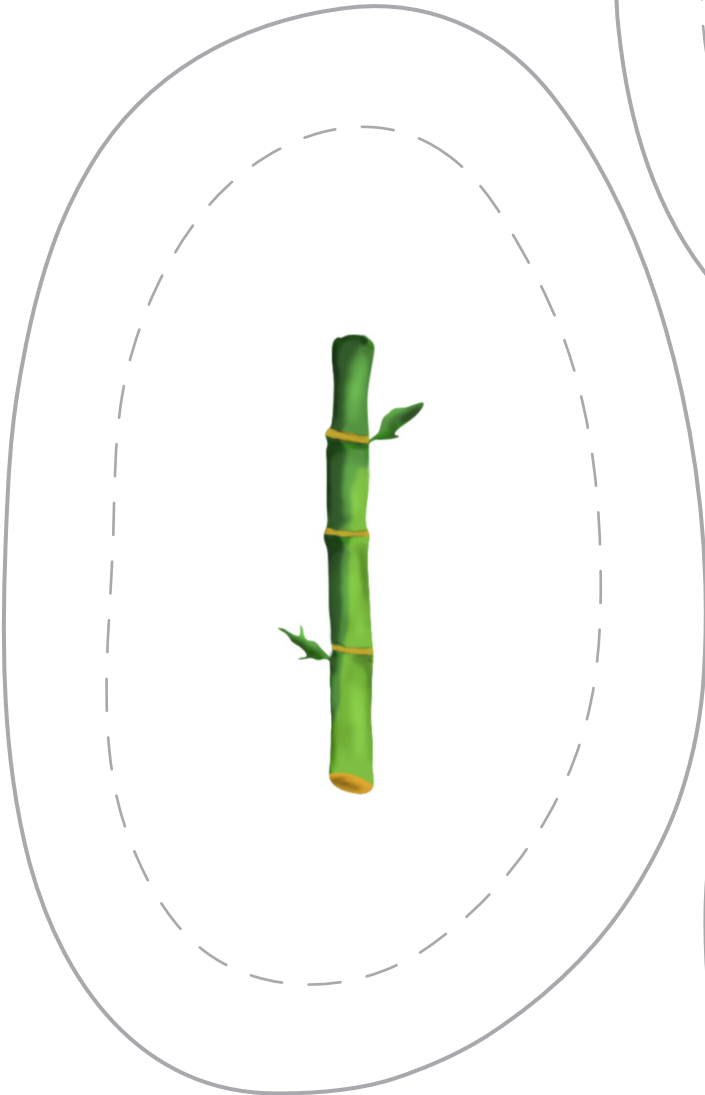
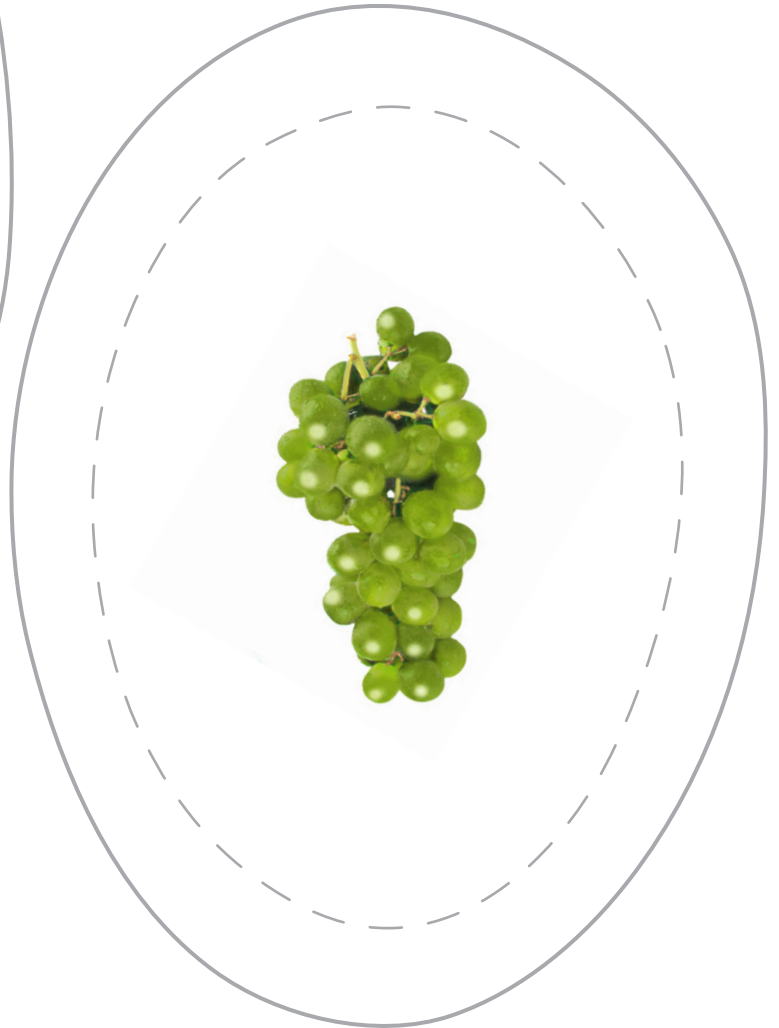
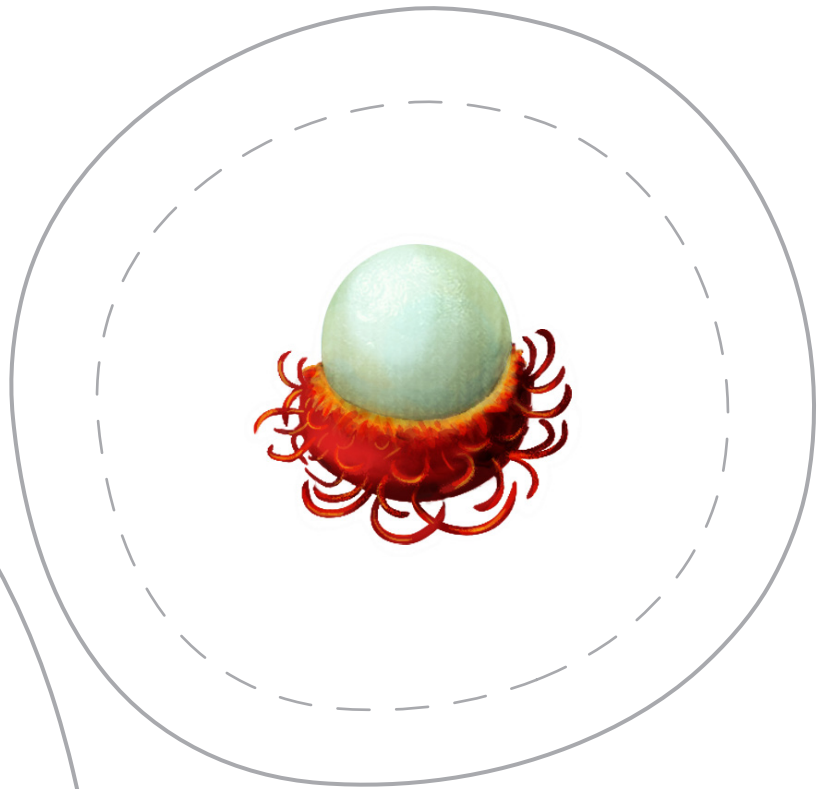
Leave open for stuffing
