Here are some of the things I can do when using ICT (information and communication technology):

I can use ICT in a variety of ways on a tablet			
I can recognise and use my own avatar (digital work)			
I can follow class rules about using digital information			
I can follow class rules when sharing personal information with known audiences			
I can safely use a tablet to complete relevant simple specified tasks, and I seek help when encountering a problem		l
